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CHILE: ATACAMA DESERT, MAIPO VALLEY, SANTIAGO, CHILEAN LAKE DISTRICT & CHILEAN PATAGONIA

February 15 – 28

From the vermillion sands of the Atacama Desert to the picturesque landscape of Chilean Patagonia, join us as we venture through lush vineyards of the Maipo Valley and the Chilean Lake District. This trip will be an unforgettable adventure with some of the most diverse and breathtaking scenery in South America paired with sensational world renowned Chilean wines.

Depart the US, flying overnight to Calama.

DAYS 1-3, SAN PEDRO DE ATACAMA: San Pedro de Atacama is the town closest to the stunning desert scenery of the Atacama Desert. Our tour will go stargazing to see constellations impossible to see in major cities, take sunset tours of the Valle de Luna, visit salt flats that extend as far as the eye can see, see geysers at sunrise, and taste wines from one of the most unique wine producing regions in the world.

DAY 4, SANTIAGO: Santiago is one of the economic powerhouses of Latin America that has views of the Andes mountains. Our tour will enjoy historic highlights related to Chile's modern and colonial era history. We will visit a restaurant with one of the largest wine lists in South America to enjoy wines that are not exported abroad.

DAYS 5-6, MAIPO VALLEY, VALPARAISO & VIÑA DEL MAR: The Maipo Valley is one of the largest wine production regions in Chile and we will taste wine at some of the most significant vineyards in Chile's global wine production. We will travel to Valparaiso, famous for its coastal scenery and funiculars, and then to Viña del Mar, known as one of the most tranquil places to visit Chile's Pacific Coast while enjoying renowned fresh seafood.

DAYS 7-9, PUERTO VARAS & CHILOÉ ISLAND: Puerto Varas is one of the capitals of Chile's famous Los Lagos Lake District region where many German immigrants settled. We will view Germanic architecture, enjoy German cuisine, and sample locally brewed German beers. We will tour the lake district as well as see views of the snow capped Osorno Volcano. While in Puerto Varas, we will visit Chile's Chiloé Island, which is home to several UNESCO World Heritage Sites and unparalleled gastronomy.

DAYS 10-12, PUERTO NATALES & TORRES DEL PAINE: Chilean Patagonia has beautiful mountains. Our tour will be based in Puerto Natales and will take a boat ride to see Balmaceda and Serrano glaciers as well as visit the spectacular lookout points of Torres del Paine's majestic scenery.

From the high art and culture of the Prado Museum in Madrid, to the whitewashed medieval villages of Cervantes, to Moorish castles and fortresses, this trip is a not-to-be-missed tour of España. Depart the US, flying overnight to Madrid.

CORSICA & SARDINIA

April 24 - May 7

DAYS 1-2, BORDEAUX: Get to know this charming city with a private walking tour. Explore the wine road to Pauillac, and visit one of the famous wine châteaux of the Haut Médoc wine region. Gourmet welcome dinner.

DAYS 3-4, BRANTÔME: Spend two nights in the picturesque village of Brantôme, once home to Charlemagne. Visit the castle of Bourdeilles, and take an excursion to the ancient capital of Aquitaine, Périgueux. Spend the day in Saint Emilion. Enjoy gourmet cuisine and amazing local wines.

DAYS 5-7, SARLAT: Spend three days in Sarlat, capital of foie gras and truffles, as well as the ancient Dordogne region. Meander through the car-free streets of this medieval village. See prehistoric cave paintings in Les Eyzies, and tour the National Museum of Prehistory. Enjoy a gourmet "lunch with a view" from the top of the ancient village of Domme. Take a tour of 12th century Beynac Castle. Go on a truffle hunt in the countryside. Take a boat ride on the Dordogne River, gliding by the cliffs of La Roque Gageac.

DAYS 8-10, ROCAMADOUR: Drive through the idyllic Périgord countryside to a beautiful country inn outside the ancient cliffside village of Rocamadour. Spend three nights at a family run country inn with an amazing chef. Take a one-of-a-kind boat ride on an underground lake in a spectacular cave. Optional balloon ride over the Alzou River Gorge. Learn how foie gras is made. Visit some of the prettiest villages in France.

DAY 11-12, ALBI: Visit the Toulouse-Lautrec Museum and tour the 13th century Sainte-Cecile Cathedral of Albi.

Depart the US, flying overnight to Paris.

DAY 1, ROUEN: The tour begins in the picturesque medieval town of Rouen, Normandy's capital. See the magnificent cathedral Monet painted so many times, the place where Joan of Arc was burned at the stake, and the narrow streets lined with ancient, half-timbered houses. Your welcome dinner introduces you to Normandy's haute cuisine.

DAYS 2-4, HONFLEUR: Spend three nights in a beautiful 18th century manor house in Honfleur, said to be the "prettiest village in Normandy." Enjoy a gourmet dinner on the picturesque harbor. Take a spectacular cliff walk in Etretat on the Channel coast. Visit a cider distillery to taste Calvados brandy made the traditional way.

DAYS 5-7, BAYEUX: Enjoy three nights in a charming inn in the center of this unspoiled Norman town. See the 12th century Bayeux Tapestry and William the Conqueror's castle in nearby Caen. Visit the Caen WWII Memorial Museum, Omaha Beach, the American Cemetery and Saint Mère Eglise with an expert World War II guide.

DAYS 8-10, SAINT-MALO: Travel to the Atlantic coast and take a guided tour of the spectacular 12th century abbey, Mont Saint Michel, France's most visited treasure. Cross into Brittany, and arrive at the charming town of Saint-Malo, your home for the next three nights. Taste the famous oysters of Cancale and visit the picturesque medieval village of Dinan.

DAYS 11-12, CONNELLES: Stop in Camembert for a picnic with fresh bread and local cheese. Spend two nights in a beautiful manor house on the Seine River. Tour the Château Gaillard, built by Richard the Lionheart, in the hills of Les Andelys. Visit Monet's famous gardens and his home in Giverny. Depart US, flying overnight to Dubrovnik.

DAYS 1-2, DUBROVNIK: Your journey begins in Dubrovnik, Croatia – the "pearl of the Adriatic" – built on a rock overlooking the sea. Narrow streets, beautiful small squares, countless historical sites. The whole city is a UNESCO World Heritage site and a dream to wander around

DAYS 3-4, SPLIT: Drive along the Dalmatian Coast, stopping for oysters in Ston. Tour a winery to try the excellent wines of the Peljesac Peninsula. Spend two nights in the vibrant coastal Roman city of Split. The Roman Emperor Diocletian built what is now the historical center as his retirement palace. Strolling around the brightly lit alleys and squares at night on the polished stone streets is an unforgettable experience.

DAYS 5-7, PLITVICE / ZAGREB: Drive along the coast to the ancient Roman town of Zadar. Take a guided tour and have lunch. Head north to the Plitvice Lakes National Park, yet another UNESCO World Heritage Site. Explore the beautiful walkways among terraced lakes and waterfalls. Spend two days discovering Zagreb, Croatia's lovely capital. Take a guided tour of the town, ride the funicular to the upper town and take an entertaining Croatian cooking class.

DAYS 8-9, BLED: Cross the Slovenian border into the Sava wine region and stop for a winery tour and tasting lunch. Your next stop is the fairytale Lake Bled. Situated at the foot of Mt. Triglav, Lake Bled is "without a doubt the most beautiful lake in the Alps." Take the Pletna boat to an island, visit Bled Castle, and sample the famous cream cake, Kremšnita. Spend two nights in a vacation home built by Mussolini.

DAYS 10-12, LJUBLJANA: Enjoy three days in the magical Slovenian capital, Ljubljana. Take an excursion to see a show of the famous dancing Lipizzan horses and visit the spectacular Postojna Cave. Take a food tour of the historic Ljubljana town center.

DAY 13: Depart for Ljubljana Airport for the flight home. For those who wish, you can continue your tour with an optional addon to Venice.
